Theft, or stealing is a criminal act and can be punishable by law.

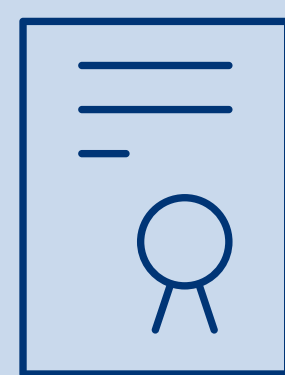
Examples include:
